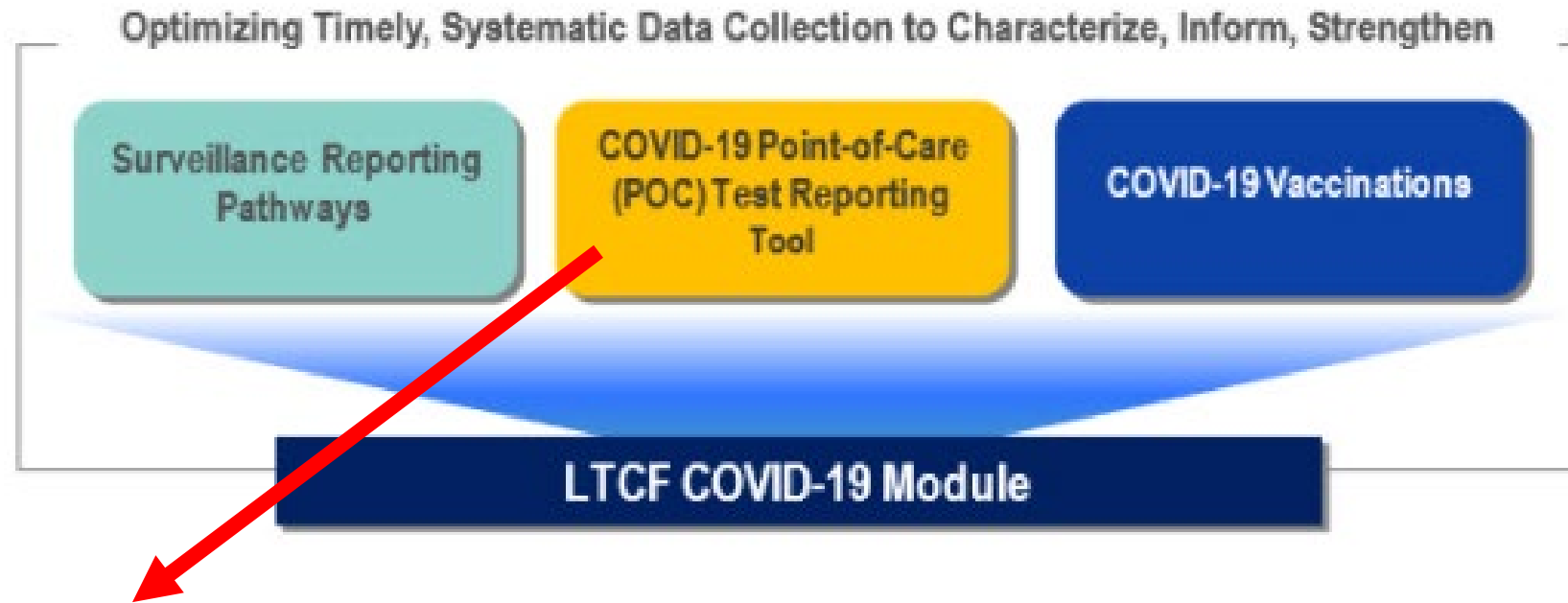

New Option for User Identity Verification in SAMS

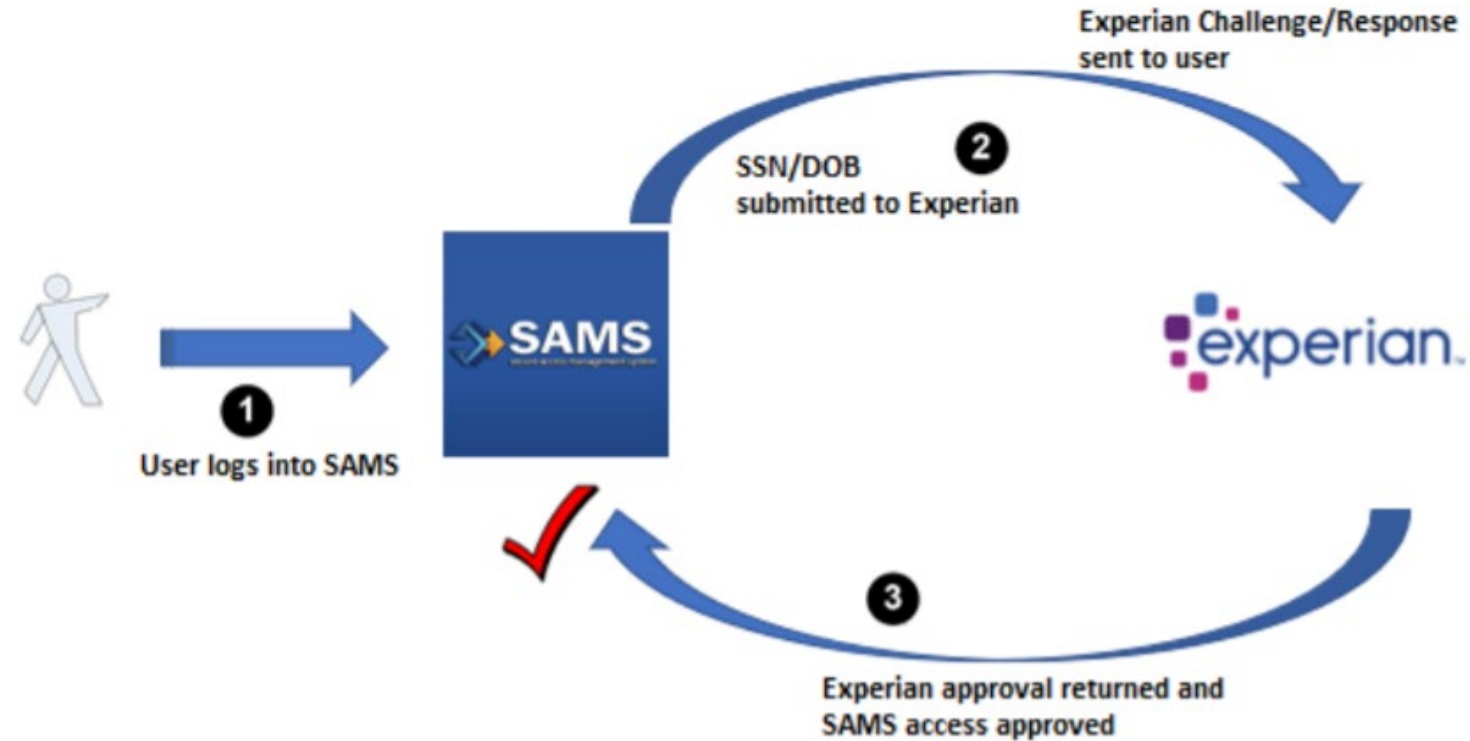


Diagram 1: Basic User Identity Verification using Experian process

If you are currently working on getting access to the SAMS LOGIN portal for your NHSN account or if you need level-3:

Option 1 - Using a secure interface, you will provide Experian with your social security number (SSN) and Date Of Birth (DOB). This information is sent directly to Experian and is NOT stored or saved by SAMS/CDC. Experian will attempt to validate your information and may ask you a series of questions based on your credit history. There is no impact on your credit score or credit worthiness. This is the fastest and safest method to complete the SAMS identity proofing process.

Entrust Soft Token & Grid Card

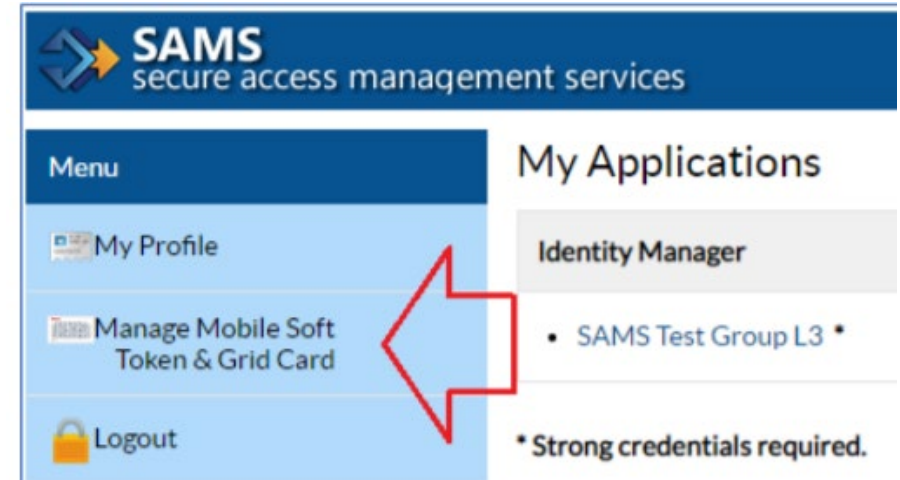
How do I request a new GRID card?

If a grid card is lost or stolen, a replacement can be requested via the Entrust Mobile Soft Token & Grid Card link located on the SAMS homepage after successfully logging in. This is the easiest and fastest way to request a new card. As soon as a new card is requested, the old card will be immediately deactivated.

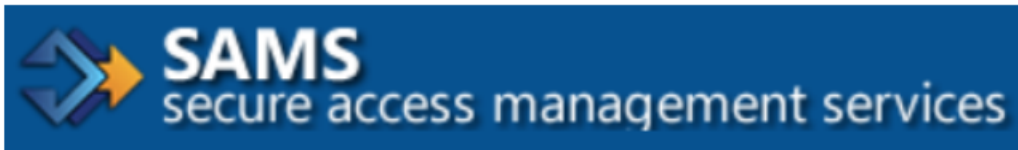
Alternatively, you can email or call the SAMS helpdesk for a new card. Before doing so, please verify the home address associated with your SAMS profile is correct.

Can level 3 users who already have a grid card also configure an Entrust soft token (mobile authenticator)? Yes, users can configure multiple soft tokens across up to three devices in addition to having an issued grid card.

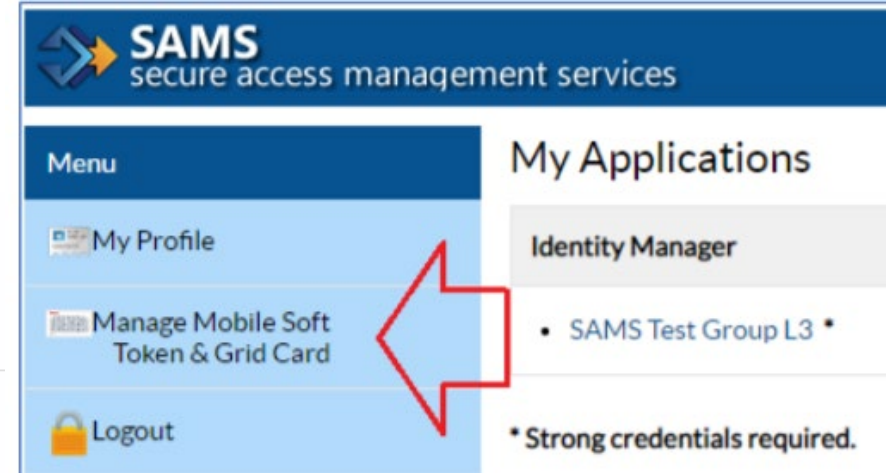

Requirements – Who in my facility must be vaccinated?

- The vaccination requirements **apply to all eligible staff**, both current and new, working at a facility regardless of clinical responsibility or patient contact, including:
 - Facility Employees
 - Licensed Practitioners
 - Students
 - Trainees
 - Volunteers
 - Contracted Staff
- The vaccination requirements also apply to staff who perform duties offsite (e.g. home health, home infusion therapy, etc.) and to individuals who enter into a CMS regulated facility
 - Example: A physician with privileges in a hospital who is admitting and/or treating patients onsite
- ✦ • This requirement does not apply to full time telework staff



Requirements – When must my facility do it?

- You must have your process or plan in place for vaccinating staff, providing exemptions, accommodations, and tracking and documenting staff vaccinations within 30-days (by December 5, 2021)



- Additionally, your process or plan for vaccinating staff must ensure that all eligible staff receive:
 - 1st Dose or One-Dose Vaccine by December 5, 2021
 - Received all shots for full vaccination by January 4, 2022



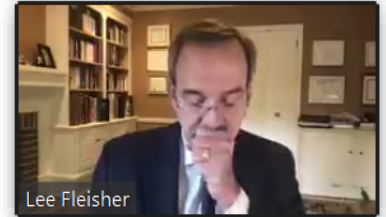

Requirements – How do exemptions work?

CMS requires facilities to allow for the following exemptions to staff in accordance with federal law:

- Recognized medical conditions for which vaccines are contraindicated
- Religious beliefs, observances, or practices



Basics for Medical Exemptions:

- Facilities must develop a process for permitting staff to request a medical exemption
- Facilities must ensure all documentation is signed and dated by a licensed practitioner
- Documentation must contain all information specifying why the COVID-19 vaccines are clinically contraindicated for the staff member
- Documentation must include a statement by the authenticating practitioner recommending the staff member be exempted

Basics for Religious Exemptions:

- Facilities must develop a process for permitting staff to request a religious exemption
- Facilities must ensure all requests for religious exemptions are documented and evaluated in accordance with applicable federal law and as a part of the facility's policies and procedures

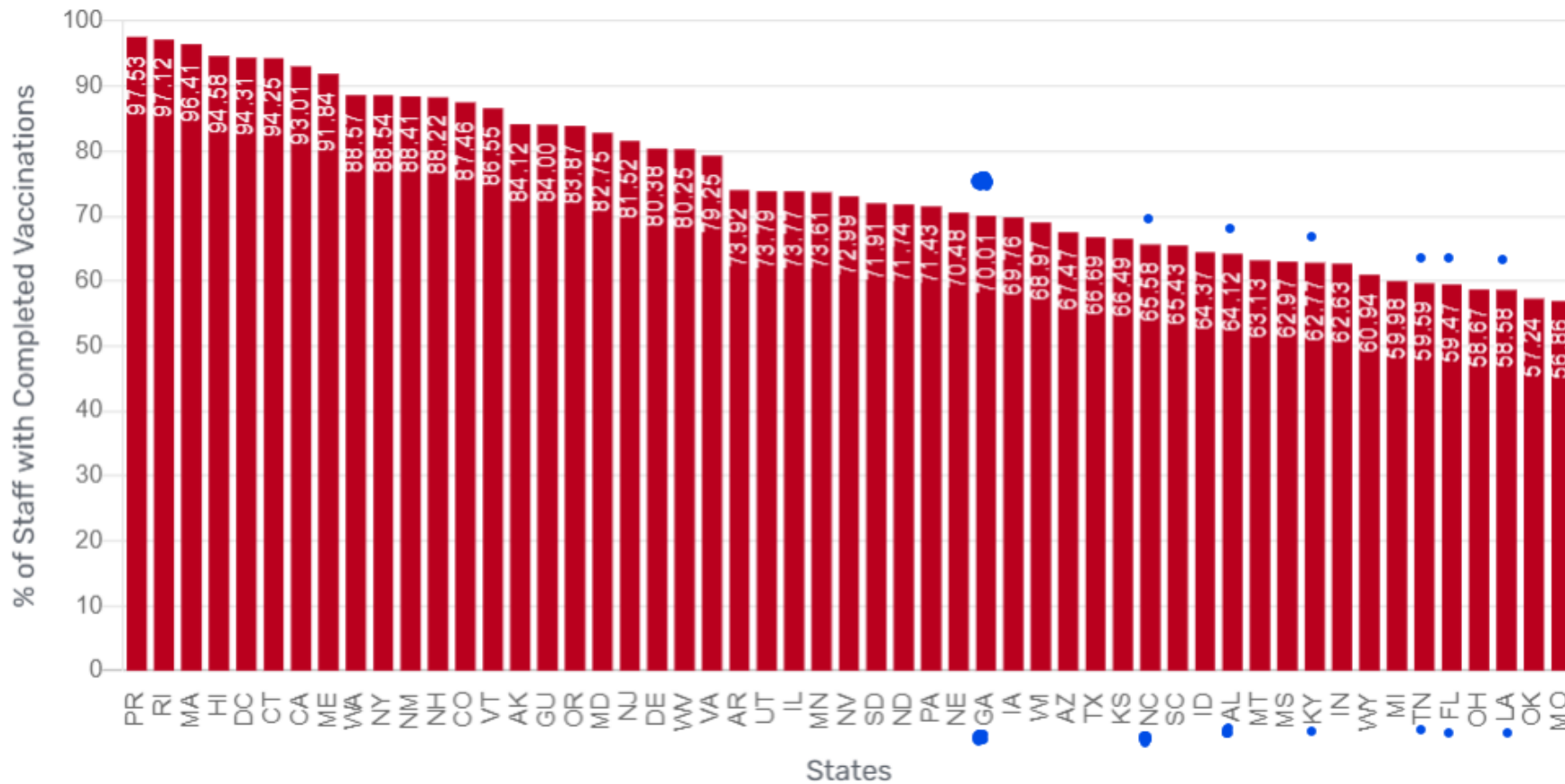

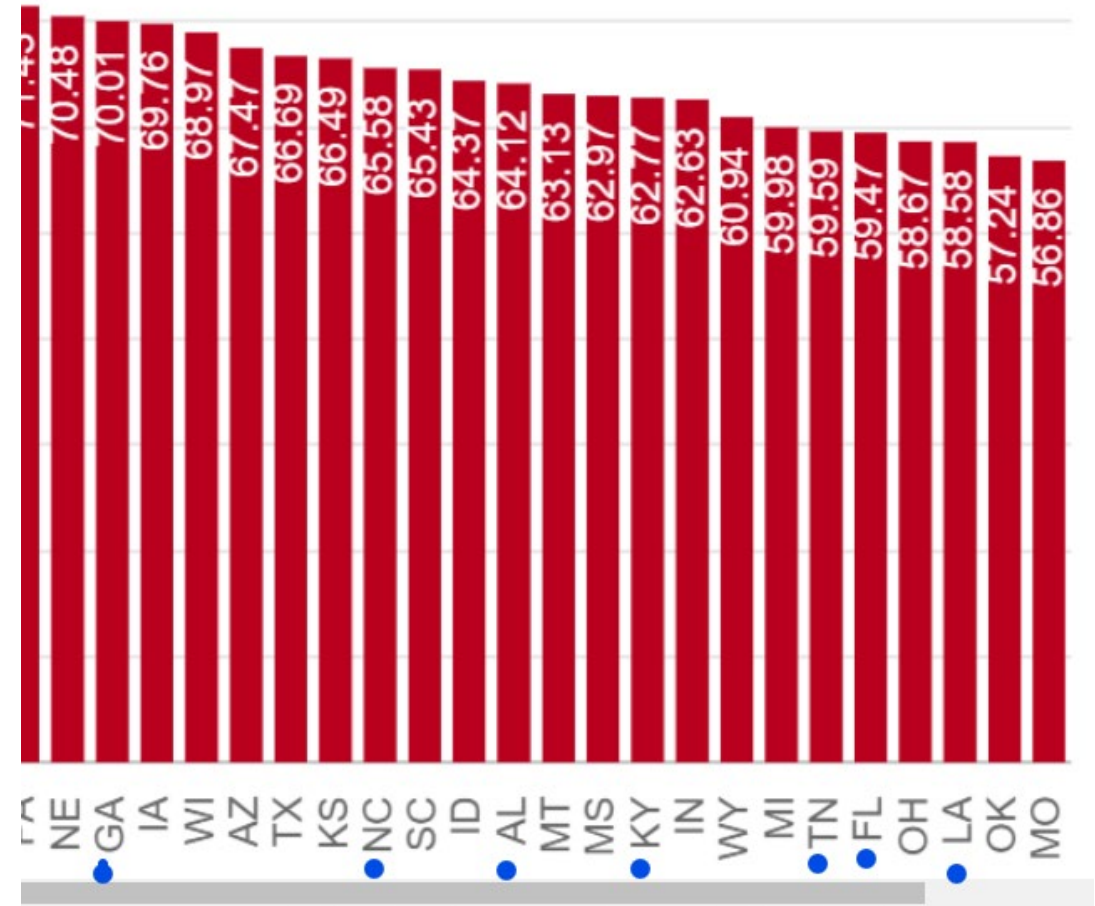
Percent of Current Staff (Healthcare Personnel) with Completed COVID-19 Vaccinations per Facility
