- Family of 4 adults
- Small Town Pharmacy
- Called ahead to schedule
- Filled out a form online prior
- Our vaccinations go into Tennis
- Appointment took 20 minutes



Joshua's Why

- Young Adult
- Works in the community with close interactions with customers
- Wears his mask and performs hand hygiene but did not feel fully protected.
- College student preparing for Fall return to campus
- Concerned he would bring COVID home to his family
- Has been socially isolated from friends
- Wants to return to normal

Jacob's Why



- Young adult
- Has been fully quarantined over a year
- Cancer survivor & immune compromised
- Oncologist statement "He would most likely be ventilated and has increased risk of death"
- College student returning to campus in the fall
- He has improved comfort knowing his mask, hand hygiene, and the vaccine will improve his protection and reduce his risk of hospitalization and death.
- Wants to move out and have his own place again



Matt's Why

- Older adult
- Active in the community
- Cares for his elderly Mother living in Senior Apartment
- Enters many healthcare organizations each week for his Mother's appointments
- Worried about bringing COVID into the home with his immune compromised son
- Vaccine Hesitant and needed conversations, education and resources to overcome myths he has seen
- Advocate now for vaccine as the myths were proved wrong through his experience



Julie's Why

- Older adult
- Auto immune disease
- Care for my immune compromised son and take him to many hospital and doctor appointments
- Concerned that myself or one of my loved ones would end up alone fighting for their lives inside a hospital
- Devastated by friends and loved ones that I have lost due to COVID
- Understand the need for vaccinations for herd immunity levels to save lives and reduce burden on the health care system and the workers
