WHAT IS IN THE TOOLKIT?


The toolkit contains a variety of resources that can be used virtually, on provider television channels or downloaded for posting or distribution.

The following tips can help your community coalition or nursing home partners move forward in action to meet or exceed your goals to reduce delirium associated readmissions and emergency department visits and/or improve your prevention, identification or management of delirium. - Identify at least one clinical and one operational champion to initiate implementation in your facility or health system.
- Charter a team to establish a timeline for implementation. Establish realistic and stretch goals that align with your organization's priorities. Alliant Health Solutions Senior Quality Advisors are available to provide guidance and coaching throughout your planning, implementation, and evaluation process and can also work with you to design any additional resources you identify as helpful to your delirium quality improvement project.
- Consider having your Patient and Family Advisors or Resident Council review the patient and family/carepartner brochures and flyers to ensure the message resonates with the populations and cultures in your service area and the materials are available in the appropriate languages.
- · Adapt materials to address priorities or current gaps in your delirium processes.
- Your logo can be added to the materials and consider posting on your facility website.
- Identify community partners who would be willing to distribute patient and family/care-partner resources in highly visible places to raise awareness of delirium.
- Print copies of the posters and FAQs and use them as handouts.
- Continue to educate your community via articles, blog posts, and social media posts.
